Dear Ms. Wisotsky, Mr. D. Messinger and Mr. E. Messinger:

Thank you very much for your generous contribution to support the World Food Program (WFP) and the agency's emergency operations in Sudan. Your gift of \$10,000, received on February 21, 2008, will make an important difference in the lives of people suffering from hunger in one of the most insecure areas of the world.

As you certainly know, in the troubled Darfur region, one of world's worst humanitarian crises intensified in 2006, despite the signing of the Darfur Peace Agreement in May of that year. The World Food Program responded by expanding its reach in Sudan to more than five million people, making Darfur WFP's largest emergency operation in the world. Because 18-20% of the Sudanese population under the age of five is malnourished, WFP relies on critical support from people like you to provide food assistance to the vulnerable children of Darfur.

Thanks to generous contributions like yours, WFP provided 150,000 meals to school children in Darfur in 2007. Offering healthy, in-school meals is an effective way to combat malnutrition and increase school enrollment from the current rate of one in five children. And school feeding does more than fight short-term hunger; it provides the opportunity to continue schooling in spite of desperate circumstances, giving children, and the country, hope for a brighter future.

WFP is the United Nations' frontline agency in the fight against hunger and the largest international food aid organization in the world. Each year, the agency feeds an average of 90 million people, two-thirds of whom are children, in 80 countries. Friends of the World Food Program is a U.S.-based non-profit organization that works to increase awareness of global hunger and mobilize resources for WFP operations.
